BYLAW NO. 10/2001

A BYLAW REGARDING TREES

The Council of the Town of Regina Beach in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

1. No person shall, on public land:
 - a) plant any tree;
 - b) damage, disturb, prune any tree;
 - c) attach any notice, bill, poster, sign, wire, rope, cord, nail or other object to or around any tree;
 - d) alter the grade level or drainage pattern in any manner so as to interfere with the access of water, or air or nutrients to any tree;
 - e) remove or interfere with any protective barrier, structure or device on or around any tree;
 - f) commence any work or activity liable to damage or interfere with the root system or upper structure of any tree;
 - g) construct any walkway, driveway or paving within a distance of .5 metres from the base of any tree for every 10 centimetres of diameter of the trunk at a point 100 centimetres off the ground;
 - h) carry out any construction, alteration, demolition or other work near or around any tree without first constructing a protective barrier;
 - i) administer any kind of pesticide.
2. Any person who desires a tree to be removed from public property shall make such a request in writing to the Council of the Town of Regina Beach.
3. When a tree is in such a condition that it could be dangerous to public safety or property, the Town has the authority to enter property to remove the tree. Also, if a tree is infested or suspected of being infested with any pests, the Town has the authority to remove the tree.
4. Any person who contravenes any provision of the bylaw is guilty of an offense punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding:
 - a) \$2,000 in the case of an individual
 - b) \$5,000 in the case of a corporation
