Regina Beach Lagoon Project

Design completion and the issuance of construction tenders for the Regina Beach Lagoon Project occurred on February 20, 2018.

On March 13, 2018 the Town of Regina Beach received 20 tenders for the construction of the Regina Beach Lagoon project

The tenders submitted ranged from \$7,280,808 to \$15,790,465.00.

Following review of all tenders, a recommendation was made to the Town Executive Committee meeting on March 20, 2018 that the low bid from Howitt Construction be recommended for Council approval. The Committee endorsed the recommendation at its meeting on March 20, 2018 and forwarded the same to Regina Beach Council for ratification.

At it's Regular Council meeting on March 27, 2018 the Council of the Town of Regina Beach ratified the tender award to low bidder Howitt Construction in the amount of \$7,270,808.00.

A start date will be determined following meeting with the successful bidder.

Further updates will be provided as they become available.

Storm Water Management Strategy

5th Avenue & 8th Street East

In the late fall of 2017, the Town's contractor Gee Bee Construction initiated the 5th Avenue/8th Street East project. The project schedule had the project start date in November 2017 with a completion date of July 2018.

The current schedule is to have work resume as early as possible in April/May, weather permitting. The work will primarily consist of grading, completion of the road surface on 5th Avenue & 8th Street East, completion of the pathway re-alignment at the north end of 8th Street East and landscaping. All construction is to be completed, weather permitting, by July 1st 2018.

General Drainage

The spring weather is challenging PWUD. With the late arrival of above average snow in early March and the delayed arrival of warmer temperatures, road conditions in the community are being impacted.

Drainage improvements completed in 2017 will help to mitigate many of the issues and impacts to the Town's road infrastructure. Since early April, PWUD staff have been working on ensuring that the existing drainage features, ditches & culverts, remain open to permit the snow melt to drain from the hillside down to the lake with minimal impact to private and public infrastructure.

For properties that require sump pumping, the Town is encouraging that outlet pipes be extended to ensure that the runoff water is directed to appropriate drainage features minimizing any adverse impacts to the road infrastructure and/or the neighbouring properties. Should there be challenges with, please contact the Town Office.

Dust Control

Public Works & Utilities have tendered the dust suppressant contract for 2018. The Tender, advertised on the SaskTenders website, will close on Monday April 30th 2018.

The plan for 2018 is to have two applications. The timing of these applications will be subject to the ground and weather conditions. With Mother Nature delaying the delivery of spring weather, the proposed applications dates may have to be modified to suit conditions.

The current schedule is to have one application completed prior to the Victoria Day long weekend in May and the second application the week before the July 1st long weekend. More updates on this initiative will be provided via the Town's website, Facebook page and community bulletin board.

Gas Tax Projects

Public Works & Utilities (PWUD) with support from the Town Council is working diligently at addressing drainage issues throughout the community. In August 2017, eleven drainage projects were identified including:

- 5th Avenue, 14th Street East to 16th Street East - 90% completed.*
- 9th Street East, 4th Avenue to 5th Avenue - 40% completed.*
- MacMurphy Avenue, 2nd Street West to 3rd Street West - 95% completed.*
- 3rd Street East/2nd Avenue Culvert Repair - Project 95% completed.*
- 400 Block Fairchild Avenue - Project on-hold pending PWUD Committee review.*
- 200 Block Fairchild Avenue - Project on-hold due to weather.*
- 3rd Street West-1st Phase - 90% completed.*
- 2nd Street West – Daly Avenue to the Lake - 95% complete.*
- 3rd Street East/3rd Avenue - Completed.*
- 400 Block MacMurphy Avenue - Project on-hold pending PWUD Committee review.*
- 16th Street East, South of Highway 54, New Storm Sewer Design - Design pending. Project to be assessed by PWUD Committee.*

In addition to the drainage improvement projects, PWUD is advancing with two projects to improve the service delivery of clean drinking water. These projects include:

- Water Treatment Plant - SCADA Upgrade - completion May.*
- Waterworks – Reservoirs -New Sensors- completion May.*

Transportation

PWUD is preparing for their spring programs that will include pothole/road repairs, tree trimming and other activities.

Residents are encouraged to report any issues with road surfaces and/or potholes.

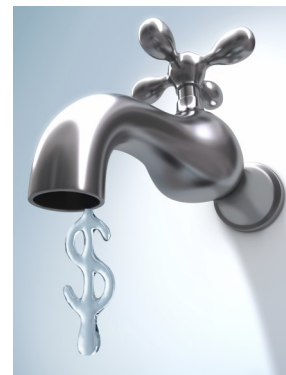

Seasonal Water Line Turn On—Beginning Tuesday May 1, 2018

Book your appointment by calling 306-729-2202 or email townoffice@reginabeach.ca

Scheduling of seasonal water line turn ON:

- Staff must have access to your water meter and shut off valve. If located inside, someone must be present at time of turn on.
- Requests must be received **no later than 3 p.m., two (2) business days** prior to the requested appointment date.
- For scheduling, the East and the West side of town have been divided between morning and afternoon, alternating over a 2 week cycle. Please be aware of this when arranging your turn on or turn off.
- If water is not able to be turned on due to repairs being required by the property owner, you will be contacted by the town office. Once repairs are completed, contact the office to reschedule a turn on.

Parks & Recreation

Dog Bylaw Reminders

All dogs must be licensed. License expires Dec 31st each year. If you haven't renewed for 2018, please come to the Town Office.

Responsible pet ownership is essential, please remember to leash your dog at all times and clean up after your pet.

Unlicensed Vehicles



With the nice weather upon us, this is a reminder that as per the law, unlicensed vehicles (Golf Carts, ATV's, Dirt Bikes, etc.) are not to be driven around town. This is enforced by the RCMP. To report concerns, please call the RCMP at 306-731-4270.

Garbage

Garbage pick up begins at 7am. To guarantee pick up garbage must be out by then. A few other things to note: garbage is to be in a garbage can/receptacle with a tight fitting lid; maximum 4 bags, bags not to exceed 35lbs. Removal of brush and bulk refuse is the responsibility of the landowner for disposal at the waste management site. Brush piles cannot accumulate for any longer than two weeks at a time.— Bylaw No. 1/2009
