The Town has undergone some changes recently. We have a new Manager of Public Works and Utilities. Please welcome Dave Willfong to our Town team. We also have a new part-time Clerk. Please welcome Marilyn.

Water Line Flushing



The annual flushing program for the water distribution system will be getting underway in mid October. Residents are advised that a temporary reduction in water pressure and/or discoloration of the water may occur. These conditions are normal during flushing activities and are only temporary. Please check your drinking, cooking, and laundry water before using. To clear your water lines, simply turn on your cold water tap or outside hose bib and let it run until the water is clear for approximately 15 minutes or more.

Tree Trimming

In September 2018, the Town initiated its tree trimming program. The Town intends to move to intersection areas to improve line of sight at intersections, as well as, key pedestrian traffic areas.

Trimming will continue till winter sets in. In early spring, the program will resume. It is planned that most of our streets and lanes will be clear of shrubs and low hanging branches by the end of 2019. SaskPower is working on tree clearance where their lines are impacted. Trimming is required for approximately 25km of roadway and lanes; a significant undertaking.



Snow Removal



All residents are being asked to make sure that road allowance is kept clear of personal property.

In accordance with by-law requirements, residents must store vehicles, boats, trailers, ice fishing shacks, or any other personal property on their own property or at an appropriate storage facility.

Lagoon Update

Contractor and consultant are aiming for substantial completion by the end of November 2018. There will be some carry over to 2019, such as concrete and asphalt works.

The contractor has been given a list of completion items. They are to meet with Town and consultant to walk through outstanding items the first week of October. The goal is to get all outstanding items cleared up by freeze up.
