### Town Council Communication Survey

Any activity on ice comes with a risk. Test the ice thickness and follow these guidelines to determine if it is safe to proceed.

4" (10 cm)	8" (20 cm)	12" (30 cm)	12"+ (>30 cm)
1 person	snowmobile	automobile, 2 tonnes	heavy truck

Used Oil Recycling

There is a tank and barrels at the town shop. The tank accepts used oil only. No antifreeze. No water. Oil filters are to be placed in 45 gallon drums. Oil containers are to be placed in the adjacent boxes.



New Water Rates  
Effective April 1, 2019

Quarterly Water Rates

Basic rates applying to: single dwellings, duplex, triplex, fourplex, multi-unit dwellings per unit:

5,000 gallons or less	\$122.50 minimum
Over 5,000 gallons	\$24.50 per 1,000 gallons
Lagoon Infrastructure Fee	
Minimum quarterly fee	\$31.00 plus 5.5% of quarterly water charge

Moderate rates applying to: lounges, bar rooms, cafes, restaurants, multi-unit retail, schools:

5,000 gallons or less	\$122.50 minimum
Over 5,000 gallons	\$24.50 per 1,000 gallons
Lagoon Infrastructure Fee	
Minimum quarterly fee	\$62.00 plus 11% of quarterly water charge

High rates applying to: laundromats, car washes, change house, campgrounds:

5,000 gallons or less	\$122.50 minimum
Over 5,000 gallons	\$24.50 per 1,000 gallons
Lagoon Infrastructure Fee	
Minimum quarterly fee	\$124.00 plus 11% of quarterly water charge

Connection (turn on) and Disconnection (turn off) water service fees:

Turn on water service fee - \$30.00 (thirty dollars).

Turn off water service fee - \$30.00 (thirty dollars).

Turn on and turn off services outside of regular working hours will be carried out in Emergency Situations only – the fee for after hour Emergency call outs will be a minimum call out rate of \$100.00 plus public works department current labour rate for hours required (minimum 1 hour) to rectify Emergency.

Snow Removal

All residents are being asked to make sure that road allowance is kept clear of personal property.

In accordance with by-law requirements, residents must store vehicles, boats, trailers, ice fishing shacks, or any other personal property on their own property or at an appropriate storage facility.

Ice Fishing Shacks

Please remember Ice fishing shacks are not to be left in the beach parking lot or on town easement/road allowance. Thank you for your cooperation.

Lagoon

Our Contractor has completed the treatment and evaporation cells as of Nov 30, 2018. Work has been completed in accordance with the contract and passed inspection. Water Security Agency will be issuing a Permit to Operate in the coming months. We have received approval to transfer fluids from the existing lagoon to the newly constructed Lagoon, pumping over started Nov 25 and continued for 2 weeks. Though the cells are complete, the truck receiving area could not be completed this season. The existing lagoons will continue to be used until the truck receiving area is completed in the spring.
